NFPA 70E Worker Training

Participants learn how NFPA 70E electrical safety practices apply to workplace tasks and how hazard recognition, protective equipment, and safe work procedures help reduce electrical exposure risks.



OUR COURSE OVERVIEW

This instructor-led training focuses on applying NFPA 70E electrical safety practices when workers perform tasks on or near energized electrical equipment.

Participants learn how shock, arc flash, and arc blast hazards can develop during electrical work. The training provides practical guidance on hazard recognition, risk assessment, approach boundaries, and establishing electrically safe work conditions.

The course supports organizations that require reliable electrical safety training for electricians, maintenance personnel, and workers exposed to electrical hazards. Training emphasizes safe decision-making, protective equipment, job briefings, and energy-control practices.

By combining NFPA 70E guidance with practical workplace procedures, this training helps workers reduce electrical exposure risks, strengthen safe work practices, and understand their responsibilities around energized systems.

Electrical safety training is most effective when workers understand both electrical hazards and the procedures used to control them. This course prepares participants to apply NFPA 70E practices during routine electrical work.

- Determine approach boundaries and recognize restricted electrical work areas.

- Select appropriate personal protective equipment and arc-rated clothing.
- Apply lockout/tagout, job briefing, and hazard control procedures.
- Understand energized work permit requirements and worker responsibilities.

Together, these learning objectives help workers develop the knowledge required to recognize electrical hazards and apply NFPA 70E safe work practices during workplace activities.



Electrical Hazard Awareness for Workers

Participants learn how energized conductors, electrical equipment, improper work practices, and changing workplace conditions can create shock and arc flash hazards. Training focuses on recognizing risks before beginning electrical tasks.

NFPA 70E Safe Work Practices

This training explains how approach boundaries, protective equipment, job briefings, lockout/tagout, and electrically safe work conditions work together to reduce worker exposure during electrical activities.



COURSE DETAILS

Prerequisites

Participants should have a basic understanding of electrical systems and workplace safety before attending the course. Familiarity with electrical equipment, hazard labels, and general work procedures is recommended.

Certification

Participants receive a certificate of completion after successfully meeting course requirements. Certification documents training in NFPA 70E worker safety, electrical hazard recognition, and safe work practices.

Compliance

This course supports OSHA electrical safety requirements and NFPA 70E practices covering hazard recognition, risk assessment, approach boundaries, protective equipment, lockout/tagout, and energized electrical work.
